The Royal Children's Hospital's (RCH) vision is A world where all kids thrive. ROLE PURPOSE
The primary purpose of this position is to ensure that surgical instruments and equipment are processed in compliance with current industry reprocessing standards of Reusable Medical Devices (RMDs), Infection Prevention and Control (IP&C) as well as RCH Policy and procedures. This position shall provide essential support by carrying out

decontamination, packaging, and preparation of critical and semi-critical medical devices in alignment with RCH policy. Furthermore, this position will ensure that the RCH Perioperative Suite and the Division of Surgery have safe, sterile, and functional instruments readily available for surgical procedures.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Perform work of a general nature under the guidance of a Grade 4 In Charge and/or Grade 5 Instrument Technician or above within the CSSD, including cleaning, packaging, and sterilisation or reusable critical and semi-critical medical devices and equipment.
- Allocations of duties to be determined by the completion of RCH CSSD training and competencies.
- Ensuring a timely delivery of services and products while following documented safe operating procedures and instructions.
- Monitoring the operation of all reprocessing equipment and reporting failures through the internal reporting system.
- Using all CSSD reprocessing equipment safely.
- Assisting with stock management to ensure continuity of service.
- Responding to enquiries and requests as required, providing good customer service.
- Maintaining communication with all CSSD staff and customers regarding reprocessing services.
- Participating in occupational health and safety programs at RCH and within CSSD.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

Essential:

- Has greater than three months experience (full-time equivalent) as an Instrument Technician with some knowledge of surgical instrumentation and sterilisation procedures and practices.

Desirable:

- Holds an Instrument Technician qualification

- Fine motor dexterity.
- Well-developed interpersonal skills, including clear written and verbal communication.
- Basic computer proficiency
- Great attention to detail and ability to listen and follow instructions
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
