<p>The Royal Children's Hospital</p> <p>The Royal Children's Hospital's (RCH) vision is A world where all kids thrive.</p> <p>RCH is located within the Melbourne Biomedical Precinct, with more than 45 world-class biomedical organisations and more than 50,000 of the brightest minds working together to make the Precinct number one in the Asia Pacific region for health, education, research, and training. Within this, RCH is also a cornerstone member of the Melbourne Children's Campus, partnering with Murdoch Children's Research Institute, The University of Melbourne Department of Paediatrics and The Royal Children's Hospital Foundation. Each organisation contributes to a paediatric academic health centre which is greater than the sum of its parts.</p> <p>RCH has cared for the children and young people of Victoria for more than 150 years since it was founded in 1870. A full range of paediatric and adolescent health services are provided plus tertiary and quaternary care for the most critically ill and medically complex patients in Victoria, Tasmania, southern NSW and other states around Australia and overseas. The hospital also supports many health promotion and prevention programs. The Hospital has more than 6,000 staff, a budget of \$850M, 12 wards and 350 beds. 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<p>ROLE PURPOSE</p> <p>To provide support to the pharmacy department for the provision of services. This support may require the undertaking of work of a more complex nature, under the direction of a pharmacist, although direct supervision by a pharmacist may not be necessary. Depending on the experience of the successful applicant may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide support in the provision of ward and department imprests and store duties.
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- Undertake prescription dispensing in the Dispensary.
- Undertake tasks and provide support in non-sterile manufacturing.
- Undertake tasks and provide support in sterile manufacturing.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

The function and overall responsibility of this position is made up of a number of roles within the department. Specific accountabilities are dependent upon where the technician is rostered for a part of, or the entire day. Most of the pharmacy technicians rotate through most areas of the department. These are made up of:

- Sterile production/preparation area duties
- Setting up of cabinets and filtration equipment
- Cleaning and sterilising equipment and work areas
- Imprest scanning and delivering of medications to clinical areas
- Dispensing prescriptions and working as part of the out-patient team
- Compounding sterile and non-sterile medications
- Recording in the S8 registers and preparing S4D and S8 medications for clinical areas
- Maintaining stock of equipment and consumables
- Reporting statistics and 'housekeeping' tasks
- Restocking and delivery of imprests as required or assigned
- Receiving prescriptions (dispensary window) and assembling medications and requisitions
- Answering telephones and maintaining civil and professional interactions with all patients and clients
- Prepare stock lists and restocking department area
- Packing medications and other medication posting tasks
- Processing prescriptions, including computer entry and assembling items - under the direct supervision of a pharmacist
- Preparing and manufacturing non-sterile pharmaceutical products, under the guidance of a supervising pharmacist
- Assessing with responsible staff members and agreeing to undertake other duties
- Work as part of the roster for weekends and public holidays

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

Essential:

- Experience as a Pharmacy Technician OR experience working in a science or laboratory based field

Desirable:

- Experience in a public hospital Pharmacy department
- Prior work with paediatrics and members of the public
- Familiarity with the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme
- Suitable Hospital Pharmacy Technician course (Certificate III or IV), or working towards a qualification
- Certification or experience in manufacturing intravenous solutions and other sterile pharmaceutical products

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

- Ability to work without constant supervision, attention to accuracy and detail and ability to communicate and co-operate with the general public.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS
